Trash Collection is on Wednesday mornings unless Virginia Beach City states otherwise, such as for holidays.

Recycle bins are collected every other Wednesday. If you have forgotten when the recycle trash is to be collected, go to this link:

Curbside bulk/large item pick-up is scheduled by request and collected by City-employed operators in City owned or leased vehicles, usually on the same day as the trash collection.

• 2 TB unflavored gelatin

- 1/4 cup cold water
- 1/4 cup boiling water
- 3 1/2 cups tomato juice
- 2 small celery ribs, diced
- 2 TB fresh lemon juice
- 1 tsp. Worcestershire sauce

Tomato Aspic Recipe

I had a sudden craving for tomato aspic, so I purchased a mold like the picture above at the <u>Kitchen Barn</u>. The original recipe is from Southern Living, but I had to slightly alter it to ensure the tomato gelatin congealed.

Ingredients

Tomato Aspic

- 1 tsp. table salt
- 1 TB onion, minced
- 1 1/2 tsp. brown sugar
- ½ cup green peppers, diced <optional>
- ½ cup sliced pimento olives
- a dash of ground cloves (1/8 tsp.)

Blue Cheese Dressing

- 1/2 cup sour cream <or 4 oz. cream cheese>
- 1/2 cup mayonnaise
- 4 oz. crumbled blue cheese
- 2 TB fresh lemon juice
- · Pinch fine sea salt

Directions

- 1. First, mix the blue cheese dressing ingredients together in a small bowl and refrigerate until the aspic mold is served.
- 2. Sprinkle the gelatin into in a bowl with ¼ cup cold water. Stir, and then let sit for 5 minutes. Whisk in ¼ cup boiling water until the gelatin has dissolved and then set aside.
- 3. Mix the tomato juice and next 8 ingredients in a large saucepan; and bring to a boil over medium-high heat. Reduce heat to low, and simmer, stirring every so often for 15 minutes. Pour the mixture through a metal strainer into a bowl; and then mix in the lemon juice and gelatin.
- 4. Pour the mixture into a 4 cup mold that has been sprayed with light olive oil on the sides and bottom. Chill for 2 hours and then gently stir in the olives or green peppers,
- 5. Return the mold to the refrigerator and chill for 4 more hours or until set. Serve with the blue cheese dressing.

Broccoli and Cheese Salad

Ingredients

- 1 large head of broccoli, use florets only and cut into bite size pieces
- 1/2 lb. bacon, fried and crumbled
- 1 onion, diced
- 1 cup sharp cheddar cheese (add before serving salad)

Dressing

- · 1 cup Mayonnaise
- 1/2 cup sugar
- 2 TB vinegar

Directions

- 1. In a small bowl, add the mayonnaise, sugar, and vinegar for the dressing and stir well. St aside until step 4.
- 2. In a small frying pan, add bacon and fry until the bacon is well-done. Crumble the bacon into small pieces.
- 3. In a medium sized bowl, add the chopped broccoli, onions and bacon.
- 4. Add the dressing to the bowl with the broccoli, and stir until the dressing coats all of the broccoli
- 5. Refrigerate.
- 6. When ready to serve, remove the broccoli salad from the refrigerator and mix n the sharp Cheddar cheese.
- 7. Serve and enjoy!.
